SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

The scholarship program is made possible in part by contributions from individual United Methodist Women and local units in the Western North Carolina Conference. There are also several endowed & named scholarship funds that have been established as a result of generous gifts to the scholarship program through the years. The most recently endowed scholarship fund was established by a donor in 2001 to honor the memory and the commitment to education of Ernest R. Ellis and Lithie Phillips Ellis. Other endowed funds include: Fannie Mit Case Scholarship Fund, Carrie Forbis Ferguson Scholarship Fund, Ronda Robbins Memorial Scholarship Fund, Ethelyne Shelley Scholarship Fund, Weaver Memorial Scholarship Fund, and the Herbin-Motley Scholarship Fund. All scholarship funds are administered by the Scholarship Committee of the Western North Carolina Conference United Methodist Women.

If you are interested in making a contribution to the scholarship funds, or in establishing an endowed scholarship fund, contact Sherry Sink, Scholarship Chairperson, for more information.

The Scholarship Program assists members of the United Methodist Church who live within the bounds of the Western North Carolina Conference of the United Methodist Church pursue an academic course leading to a church-related vocation other than ordained ministry. Scholarships have been helping deserving students called to be spiritual leaders in the United Methodist Church since the 1940s. Recipients must attend one of these five colleges or universities:

- Bennett College Brevard College •
- Greensboro College High Point University •Pfeiffer University •

REQUIREMENTS

- 1. All applicants must apply in writing to the Chair of the Scholarship Committee.
- 2. All applicants must be members of the United Methodist Church and reside within the bounds of the Western North Carolina Conference. Scholarship recipients shall pursue an academic course in one of the five United Methodist-supported colleges or universities in the Western North Carolina Conference.
- 3. All applicants must have references from the following people: The applicant's pastor, a faculty member of the school last attended, a peer group person, and a business or professional person who knows the applicant through some experience outside the church. Forms will be provided.
- 4. All applicants recently graduated must supply a transcript of their high school record. In the case of a second-career applicant who has not been in school recently, a transcript will not be required.
- 5. All applicants must complete a confidential report of family/individual income and financial obligations. A form will be provided.
- 6. All applicants are to be interviewed each year by the Scholarship Committee, or be interviewed by a person selected by the Chair of the Scholarship Committee, prior to granting scholarships. Interviews will be held in the spring.
- 7. No applicant will be considered until all requirements are met. A small, non-returnable picture attached to the application will be helpful to the Scholarship Committee. All applications are due by March 1 each year.



TAKING A STAND FOR SOCIAL ACTION

My UMW Sisters,

Unfortunately, the Human Trafficking Seminar we were planning for October has been postponed to a later date. We realized that it came in conflict with the UMW Ubuntu Day of Service and we would not want anyone to have to choose between the two great events. The new date will be decided at a later time.

Those who say, "I love God," and hate their brothers and sisters, are liars; for those who do not love a brother or sister whom they have seen, cannot love God who they have not seen. The commandment we have from him is this: those who love God must love their brothers and sisters also. 1John 4:20-21

The UMW has many areas of emphasis. Most of the time we focus on Human Trafficking and sometime domestic violence, but rarely do we like to talk about immigration. This can be a very controversial topic. It can be debated on many levels, and no matter what your view may be, there is immigration throughout the entire Bible. Jesus himself was an immigrant. The United Methodist Church has a policy that says "The United Methodist Church commits to engage in strong, coordinated advocacy on migration issues and on behalf of actions that overcome poverty, war and other causes leading to the displacement and marginalization of people" (Resolution 6028, Global Migration and the Quest for Justice," The Book of Resolutions). How will you and your local unit help enforce this policy and how can we as a district put this into action?

September is a busy month in the Social Action area! One of the most significant dates is September 21st. On this day, we have been invited and encouraged to observe this day as the International Day of Peace. We have been encouraged to observe this day on a local, district, national and international level. Take a few minutes to pray and reflect on the war and unrest in our world. Pray for peace and for those men, women, and children who struggle everyday without peace in their lives.
